As we move into the month of March, we are heading into what I believe is the busiest time of the church year. The period of Thanksgiving to Christmas and New Year's is surely a hectic six-plus weeks of unending activities. However, at least for pastors, Lent and Easter pack a wallop for our schedules. From March 5th (Ash Wednesday) through April 20th (Easter Sunday), the work of the Lord contains many worship opportunities that we pray you will be part of at this crucial time of the year.

An outline of Lent/Easter worship times was noted in my February Newsletter article, and you will find information on these activities throughout this Newsletter, and other places, as we travel the path of Lent with our Savior. I hope you will take some time to be part of these worship schedules.

So, as we enter the period leading us to Jesus' sacrifice and glorious resurrection, what does this part of the year mean to you? What it meant to Jesus was that the Father had commanded Him to be the sacrifice for our sins, and with all of Jesus' power He carried out God's promise of our redemption.

# *"When the days drew near for him to leave this earth, Jesus "set his face" to Jerusalem to encounter the pain of the cross on our behalf." (Luke 9:51).*

In the same way we set our faces toward the cross of Christ that stands before us. As we face the cross during Lent, we see certain aspects of our lives which do not always fall in line with what the cross truly means for us. We come to terms with these "aspects" with Christ—who came to set us free from sin so that we can see him face-to-face in heaven. In the six-plus weeks called Lent, we should review where we stand with Jesus, and how we will live by following Jesus' path to redemption.

My wish is for you to take the season of Lent to become even more connected with God and join us in the various worship services we will have at Grace Lutheran. God is amazing in providing forgiveness and grace and love to all who accept what the Father freely provides.

# Romans 5:8 "But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us."

Hebrews 9:28 "So Christ was sacrificed once to take away the sins of many; and he will appear a second time, not to bear sin, but to bring salvation to those who are waiting for him."

Because Jesus answered the Call of the Father to be the sacrifice for our sins, *"It is Finished"* (John 19:30), and we can expect to live forever in the house of the Lord. That is something to be very thankful for! And we show our thanks by loving God, and our neighbor! And a beautiful place to start is at church. See you soon.




# March 5

Be with us for an evening of beautiful song and scripture as we present Holden Evening Prayer beginning Sunday night, March 9th at 6PM.


Holden Evening Prayer is a vesper service written during the winter of 1985-1986 at Holden Village in the North

## Seven Words Listening to Christ from the Cross

#### **Congregational Council Meeting - February 11, 2025**

Robert Martin called the meeting to order with a reading of the Mission Statement.

Deborah Ruff shared devotions for February from First Corinthians 13 titled "A Real Love Connection" centered around the Agape Love of God.

Pastor's Report: Meghan Bryant will lead Vacation Bible School with a tentative start date of June 22. A Sparkhouse Augsburg 60 week course over 2 years is recommended for Youth who will soon be ready for confirmation. Len Fulmer pledged to pay for the instruction material. Pastor Rich Johnson at Mt. Tabor has resigned to be Chaplain at Lowman Home. There is a free texting program with up to 10,000 texts a month that is available to Grace. After discussion, the council agreed that the Lutheran flag and United States flag should be present in the sanctuary to honor our faith and our military veterans.

Adoption of Reports: Robert made a motion to accept the reports as presented, seconded by Sue Mitchell, and passed.

Grace's constitution is under review by the Constitutional By-Laws Committee.

There is no update on YouTube streaming at this time.

The Ministry Center meter is installed, and backflow inspection has been completed by Fulmer Plumbing. The \$1251.00 cost to refit 2" copper pipes will be paid from the Property and Maintenance account.

Handicap parking pavement has been delayed due to rain and will be installed as soon as the weather breaks.

Chop Cooper received a best bid of \$1906.50 to replace the motor for the kitchen exhaust fan over the Ministry Center stove. Linda Cromer made a motion to accept this bid with second by Chad Frick and it passed. Discussions took place about replacing light bulbs to be addressed at the next meeting.

Council representatives were appointed to the Ministry Teams. Andy Metz and Sue Mitchell agreed to co-chair the Lifelong Education Team.

Ministry Team Updates: George Dawkins provided an update that the Stewardship Team is scheduled to meet next week with plans to make a presentation to the congregation in September.

A date was set for a congregational meeting and vote on March 9 to determine what to do with the parsonage.

Shepherding concerns were discussed.

The next council meeting will be on March 11 at 6:30 pm.

The meeting was adjourned with a prayer by Pastor Dave.


