From Our As I write this, we will soon be bringing to an end the season of Epiphany and moving into the Lenten Season. Just as Christmas Eve brought us both to the fourth Sunday of Advent in the morning and Christmas Eve in the afternoon and evening, this year Ash Wednesday falls on Valentine's Day. Someone posted on Facebook that perhaps this year we could impose the ashes in the shape of a heart rather than a cross. In many ways, the cross does indeed say

love. So, while we will practice the traditional imposition of the cross, that connection to the heart does give us something to ponder.

Lent also brings us time to ponder the depth of agape love freely given to us through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus, God's beloved Son and our Redeemer. And I'm convinced the broader church is at a critical juncture in discerning its mission in these post -pandemic, post-modern days of the twenty-first century. That brings us, of course, to the first guestion before us this year. What is the church? What does it mean to be the body of Christ on this earth in this day and in this time? I encourage you to use these days of Lent to ponder your thoughts on this question. Just this morning I listened to someone bemoaning the fact that the church she knew no longer exists. That's true. The challenge before us in these days is to listen carefully to the story of our Lord's journey to the cross, to pay heed to the stirring of the Holy Spirit (not just individually, but collectively as this body of Christ known as Grace Lutheran Church), and to be open to becoming the church we are newly called to be.

And secondly, Lent is the perfect time for us to focus (individually) on the second question before us. What's the difference between a member and a disciple? Oftentimes our Lenten disciplines invite us to "give up" something for Lent. I think more so Lent provides us an opportunity to "add" something to our faith practices - those things that identify us as disciples and not members. Many challenges lie ahead of us here at Grace. Stewardship is a biggie! And all three dimensions of stewardship - time, gifts for ministry and money - provide opportunity for growth. While it is easy (and common in many congregations) for a few to do most of the work, we are moving toward finding a way for each and every member to serve in some way. Remember that verse from I Corinthians 12: 7 as recorded in The Message, "Each person is given something to do to show who God is." Lent is a perfect time for us to discern those gifts. And needless to say, we need to grow our financial giving so that not only salaries meet guidelines but that all ministry teams have adequate funds to carry out their ministries and so that our facilities can be kept in good condition. So, Lent invited us to ponder our financial giving as well.

May God keep us struggling and growing in the Lenten days before us.
