I know I've said this in sermons a number of times since I've been here and I said it again this Sunday. THE MOST IMPORTANT THING WE DO ON THIS EARTH IS WORSHIP! I first heard Bishop Leonard Bolick say that some years ago now, but as COVID and other societal events have brought major changes into our 21st century days of living, I think that becomes even more true. No longer is the church the center of the community. No longer is Sunday morning sacred time. No longer are Wednesday evenings reserved for "church" time. It's

a new day. And so, both opportunity and challenge are before us as we shape the North American Church of the 21st century. And worship is the central focus of church!

So, that brings me back to worship. For many of us worship has just been something you do. In my family – and I'm guessing in many of yours - when the church doors were open the whole family went to church. And while we did "go to church" the depth of the gifts of worship were sometime not on the forefront. And so, the question: what is worship? What is worship? My homiletics professor in seminary asked us that question in class one day. After we gave the standard answers, he asked another question. Suppose, he said, worship is a drama. Who would you say is the actor? Who the audience? That led to some interesting discussion. Let me share his insights. If worship were a drama, then God is the actor and we, the congregation, are the audience. Everything we receive in worship comes from God. The words of forgiveness, the words of the scriptures, the words of the liturgy and hymns, the words of sermon proclamation, the meal—all are gifts from God – gifts from God we receive in worship—and nowhere else. In that sense, God is the actor. So, he continued, what if we taught our people to remember that when they come to worship—not when they "go to church" but when they come to worship—they find themselves in the very tangible presence of God? Would that make a difference? Would we, the congregation, pay more attention to the words we are speaking or singing? Would we, the congregation, find it easier to be still and know that God is God instead of looking at our watches (now our phones) and getting upset at the number of verses in a hymn or God forbid, a new hymn we have to learn? Would we stay more centered on the gifts of God for the people of God rather than on whatever is on our minds that day, that moment. Would visualizing God's tangible presence right there in front of us make a difference in how we worship? In summary, then, the professor said to us that for us Lutherans, worship is indeed not so much about what we do, but about what God does for us. We simply respond in prayer and praise to the God who comes down to our level. The focus in Lutheran worship is not on how we feel but on how God comes to us.

So, ponder a little. How might these insights on worship change/grow you? How might these insights on worship change/grow our worship here at Grace. Important questions, I believe, because I also believe worship is the most important thing we do on this earth. God's Peace, *Pastor Jane*

How YOU Can Help Grow Grace's Social Media Presence

The suggestion has come up that Grace could use social media more. We *can* do that — it starts with each of us individually interacting with Grace on social media more! Here's what **you** can do on Facebook to help:

1.) LIKE AND FOLLOW

Make sure you have liked and are following **Grace Lutheran Church-ELCA** on Facebook! Even if you think you are already good on this step, go check! You might be surprised. By liking the page, you are showing support of Grace, and by following the page, you should be getting updates from Grace in your news feed. Right now our page is sitting at 629 likes and 732 followers. That may seem like a lot already, but let's see how much we can increase these numbers!

2.) REACT AND COMMENT

When you see posts from Grace Lutheran Church-ELCA, like (or love) them and comment on them! Facebook's algorithm prioritizes posts that generate higher levels of interaction, so the more reactions and comments a post gets, the more the post is likely to show up in people's news feeds (and the higher up in them too). The amount of reactions and comments on the church's posts also can be looked at as reflecting how engaged (or not) we are in what's happening at Grace.

3.) SHARE

When we want to tell people about Jesus, what do we say we should do? Share the good news! So if you want to tell people about Grace, what can you do? Share Grace's Facebook posts! A post promoting an upcoming worship service or event? Share it to invite your friends! A post with pictures from a church gathering or activity? Share it to show your friends the good time you had at Grace or what Grace is doing for the community! The more shares our posts get, the more people they can reach, and the more our social media presence grows.

4.) HELP PROVIDE CONTENT

Our volunteer Facebook administrators can't be at everything. But you might be there with your phone, so take some pictures if you don't see anyone doing so! Or plan ahead and let us know you're willing to take pictures at an event or group gathering and will send them to us to post! (Think: Grace's turn volunteering at Manna House, Grace's presence at Trunk-or-Treat, a Women's Bible Study gathering, etc.) People like to see pictures on Facebook of our church events and Grace at work! Help us be able to never miss an opportunity to post this kind of content!

BONUS: Did you know our preschool started their own Facebook page in October 2023? Show your support for this ministry of the church by liking and following **Grace Christian Preschool** on Facebook too!
