From Our Interim Pastor

As I write this we have yet to enjoy Thanksgiving this year, yet Christmas decorations are up in stores and on houses, Christmas carols are playing everywhere. Hallmark Christmas movies abound. And then, at midnight on Christmas Day, it will all be over and all the hype for Valentine's Day will begin. But in here, in the church, especially in our Lutheran churches, we are celebrating the Advent Season. And if ever there is a season of the church year so out of sync with society, it's that now/not yet Season of Advent, the season of alertness, of preparation, of patience as we prepare not only to celebrate the birth of the Christ Child so many years ago now, but also to prepare for his second coming.

The Season of Advent brings us many gifts, but perhaps one of the most important is a tangible awareness that we are looking both for the God among us now and the God, who in the risen Christ, is coming again. And in these days of war and hate and violence, nothing could be more important than an awareness of the presence of God among God's people.

I have a book that I've often used for devotions during Advent and Christmas. It's called *Kneeling in Bethlehem*, a collection of poems written by Ann Weems and published by The Westminister Press way back in 1980. In her very first poem she writes of the theme of this Advent Season – The Coming of God. Here are her words.

Our God is the One who comes to us in a burning bush, in an angel's song, in a newborn child. Our God is the One who cannot be found locked in the church, not even in the sanctuary. Our God will be where God will be with no constraints, no predictability. Our God lives where our God lives, and destruction has no power and even death cannot stop

the living.

Our God will be born where God will be born,

but there is no place to look for the One who comes to us.

When God is ready

God will come even to a godforsaken place like a stable in Bethlehem.

Watch...

for you know not when God comes. Watch, that you might be found whenever wherever

God comes.

Building Loan Debt to Be Paid Off by the End of the Year!

By mid-November, our estimated need to



finish paying off the Ministry Center building loan was about \$5,200 more than was held in the Building Fund. We Debt Reduction anticipate receiving sufficient Building Fund offerings over

the next few weeks to meet this need, but if we do not. Council has authorized use of the Larry Spotts Gift funds to finish paying off the building loan by the end of the year.

Through some wise financial moves, faithful giving, and special principal gifts, our debt has been reduced from more than \$195,000 at the beginning of 2023. Thanks be to God that our goal of paying off the Ministry Center loan by year's end is within reach!

Once this loan is paid off, we encourage the congregation to continue to faithfully give to meet our Current Fund budget needs and anticipated large maintenance expenses such as roof and boiler replacement.

and sandwich lunch following Soup AND SANDWICH worship on Sunday, Dec. 3, the FEWOWSHIP first Sunday in Advent.




A sign up sheet is on the narthex board for volunteers to bring soup, sandwiches, and desserts. We encourage

friends for Advent 2023 due to the declining number of individuals willing to write devotions.





The planned upgrade to our livestreaming capabilities should take place in the next few weeks. Gattis




Pro Audio, who installed our sound system, will be installing the upgrades which include a cam-

Council Meeting - Tuesday, Nov. 14

Council met with Pastor Rick Carter from the SC Synod Office. Pastor Carter emphasized that Grace has ownership over what church is chosen for partnership. Pastor Carter shared that the process for exploring partnership between two churches generally starts with meetings between the two congregational executive committees. Deborah suggested

to wait until after the new executive committee is elected in December for this outreach. Until then, Pastor Carter recommended to review the partnership covenant drafted by the Wake Up Team to ensure expectations of the pastor for office hours and pastor care, finances, and worship services are included; this document is used in conversation with potential partnership congregations. Pastor Carter also suggested for Grace to update its ministry site profile, which helps the Synod identify pastoral candidates.

All reports were accepted as presented, and the draft budget was approved for presentation at the December congregational meeting. Council voted to maintain the monthly contribution toward mission support in the Synod over the next year and decided to contribute the Advent/ Christmas offering to Interfaith Community Services.

Robert presented an estimate of remaining debt on the Ministry Center, and Council voted to apply Spotts' gift funds toward the approximately \$5,200 needed to pay off the loan before the year's end. Council discussed the need to focus efforts on maintenance once the loan is paid off and advised for the Facilities Team to create a list of upcoming property/maintenance needs and approximate costs.

Council voted to apply funds from the sound system account toward the balance of the livestream installation. The candidate for church administrative secretary accepted the position, and Beverly planned to explore another candidate for treasurer duties.
