What the Preschoolers Taught Me

For more than two years now I have had the privilege of leading our preschoolers in chapel on Tuesday mornings. The normal pattern is for the "twos" to come together at one time and the "threes and fours" to come at a different time. At first, it was all a struggle for me. All my school teaching experience had been at the middle and high school levels. Communicating

with and connecting to younger ones had not been something I was accustomed to; but over the months and years, I grew to cherish this time with them. Admittedly, the best I ever learned to do with the "twos" was sing *Jesus Loves Me* and have a little prayer, but even that became holy ground time. With the closing program and graduation nights of last week (May 13 and 14), my chapel time with them has ended. A newly called pastor will lead them in chapel next year and my prayer is that she or he will grow as much as I have.

My growth has come in various ways, but recently three little theologians have spoken powerful words of wisdom. You have heard all three of their "sermons" in my sermons, but I want to list them out for you again because I think they are guiding words of wisdom for life.

First sermon: I called him Oscar, after our puppet that also attends chapel. It was St. Jude Trike Day and I didn't think they would want to go back inside the sanctuary for chapel so we just sat down outside for a song and a prayer. But little two-year old Oscar looked at me with sad eyes and said, "But I want to go in the church with you for chapel." Sermon One: Going in the church for chapel where God invites us to be – every Sunday.

Second sermon: In chapel one day I asked them, "What makes you strong?" "Vegetables... fruit...sleep...play" came the answers. "What makes us strong in the Lord? "Chapel... prayers...songs...offerings" came the answers. All correct. But as they lined up to go back to their classrooms, a four-year-old pulled on my arm and pointing at the cross hanging in our chancel he said, "I know what makes us strong in the Lord. Just keep your eyes on the cross." What better words to guide us in living as Jesus calls us to live than these? Sermon two: Just keep your eyes on the cross.

Third sermon: "What's that?" "Our baptismal font." How do you get in there? What a challenge this little one offered up. How do we get into our baptismal clothes and live out our baptismal vows? It's simple! Just remember that it is through baptism that we are named and claimed as a child of God and equipped by the gift of the Holy Spirit to be God's faithful people. Sermon three: Jump into your baptismal clothes head first!

Worship regularly...Keep your eyes on the cross always....and wear your baptismal clothes daily. I can't think of anything else that would make us more Christ-like. And that, after all, is what we're called to be – "little Christs" for the sake of the world.

Thank you, my preschoolers, for teaching me well.

We will be volunteering on Tuesday, June 18! Be on the lookout for more information!


