From Our Interim **Pastor**

"Don't just stand there. Do something!" Now, while there are times when we need to stop doing and simply remember to be still and let God be God, there's also some valuable teaching in the DO SOMETHING as well.



Several Sundays ago now, Oct. 8 to be exact, in our gospel reading for the day Jesus responded to a trap question to him from the chief priests and elders about his authority to teach in the synagogue with a trap question of his own back to them. He told them an allegory about a father and his two sons. One son said he would go work in the vineyard and didn't go; the other said he wouldn't go and did. "Which one did the will of his father?" Jesus asked those religious leaders. Their reply, the one who said no but went, got them in trouble. "That's you," Jesus said. "You speak the

words, but you fail to follow through with actions – with behaviors that reflect your living out the words you speak."

I recalled that we Lutherans down through the ages have struggled with the place of good works in our daily lives. We truly believe that it is by grace that we are saved and that nothing we do or don't do can add to or subtract from what Jesus did for us through his death on the cross and his resurrection from the dead on that first Easter morning. Yet, good works have a clear and definitive place in our theology. Luther tells us our good works are our response to God's grace. Just like the allegory – our lives need to reflect in every way that which we believe.

I issued a challenge to the congregation that day to DO something the next week that put your faith in action and we shared those responses during children's time. Here they are! Gave a co-worker a ride to work and home, gave a grieving mother a book about grief, bought food for our Thanksgiving meal bags, helped Nana weed her flower bed, greeted employees at the grocery store, called a sick friend and asked about covid, picked up trash in a neighbor's yard while she was out of town, let an elderly man go ahead of me in the grocery line. Those were the responses you shared that day. And in each and every act of kindness, the love of Jesus was shared with someone in need.

I don't think I need to say this broken, war-torn world of ours needs to see the face of Jesus every day in every way. Hateful words, spiteful deeds, sinful actions prevail across the world and especially these days in the Holy Land. While any efforts at resolution are complex at best, we can pray, and we can continue to put our words into action so that the love of Jesus for the whole world might be experienced. Deeds of kindness and love have a way of bringing out the best in us – not only in the receiver but in the giver as well.

This prayer, a universal prayer for peace from the Iona Community, offers us the way from words to action.

Lead us from death to life. From falsehood to truth. Lead us from despair to hope, From fear to trust. Lead us from hate to love. From war to peace. Let peace fill our lives. Our world, our universe. Peace, Peace, Peace.

Council held its regular monthly meeting on Tuesday, Oct. 10.

Council discussed a draft letter and approach for outreach to inactive members to update the church roster.

Council also reviewed the draft parish agreement composed by the

Pastor Jane shared an invitation from the Synod office to participate in Ministry Toolbox events Oct. 28 and Nov. 18.

All reports were adopted unanimously.

Council agreed on Nov. 5 and 19 as nomination and voting dates for council election.

Council provided comments on a draft 2024 budget from the Finance Team, which will be considered at the Dec. 10 congregational meeting.

Beverly shared updates on the secretary hiring process from the Personnel Team and that a viable candidate had been identified. Council discussed the proposed work hours and shifting financial duties to a paid treasurer position.



Council discussed increased property insurance premiums and plans to ask the Facilities Team to have the roof condition assessed.

The Youth Ministries Team reported having programs planned through the end of the year.

The Care and Fellowship Team is looking ahead to the Advent kickoff.

The Visioning Team met in October and will meet again in early November to continue discussion about ministry team activities.
