From Our As I write this, we have just completed our Ash Wednesday services, First Sunday in Lent morning service and our first Lenten evening worship focused this year on The Trial of Judas - the punishment phase. I pray all of these services thus far have led you into the disciplines of Lent prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Deeper prayer life, fasting from those things that stand in the way of a deeper relation-

ship with Jesus and an offering of our gifts to the church as we strive to follow in the footsteps of Jesus – that's what Lent is about! Thinking that most, if not all, who read these words will already know the meaning of Lent and are already into your Lenten practices, I decided not to say more about Lent, but to share with you what I am experiencing here at Grace as I, on the second Sunday of March, will complete two years as your interim pastor.

When I arrived, Grace (and all other congregations) was just beginning to gather again in person for worship and other congregational activities following all the isolation that COVID imposed on us. Those early days of "returning to normal" or maybe "returning to a new normal" were difficult. Loss of community, loss of vision and mission confusion about current identity and purpose - all defined us. In fact, as we began early on - too early, in fact - to complete the Ministry Site Profile for the call process – the word "complacency" was chosen to describe Grace. But then, the Wake UP Team got busy. I shared with them and the congregation council what a navy admiral had shared with me when I joined the bishop's staff in North Carolina. "It literally takes three miles to turn a battle ship in the ocean," he said, "so as you think about paradigm shifts in a congregation, remember that." That's been our operating plan these past two years - turn the battle ship - move Grace from that complacency to vitality. And that is happening, dear friends, that is happening.

The ship is turning. I'd say we're a good mile into that journey and that's amazing! I invite you to open your eyes and see what's happening here at Grace. I invite you to unclench your fists and let go of whatever it is you need to let go of so that you can see – better yet – that you can join in turning the ship those last two miles. And I can't help but throw in this caution. Mitch often says, "if all you have is a hammer, then everything looks like a nail," So, another invitation! Please let go on preconceived impressions, experiences, observations - let them go and be open to how the Spirit is moving here at Grace! We are being led into a new day!

Here are a few things I see! Worship attendance is steady and with on-line streaming, growing. Johnny is training at least seven to operate our new system. That's a model for all teams and task forces as we move forward. Invite, in person, others to join your team! Julie and Jessica have brought energy to our youth program, including a Sunday school class. Word is the youth are participating! Parents, thanks for getting them here! Youth, thanks for joining in! The council at its last meeting heard a presentation on two possible stewardship programs Grace needs to consider. Energy and excitement abounded and further discussion and possible decision will come in March! The Trial of Judas is underway. An excellent cast is in place and 47 people attended that first Lenten service. One person said. "I didn't want it to end!" When has anyone last said that about a worship service!!!!! And, then, my goodness, there's the work of council and now call committee as we now move intentionally into the interview process of calling a new pastor. All this is happening along with other more established ministries — backpack ministry, Manna House, kids' bucket, women's bible study, active LMM - and add to all this our preschool! What a delightful group of children and dedicated staff! Grace is alive and growing! Be still and listen – the Spirit is inviting you to join in!


#### **Lutheroad Day Camp July 17-21**





## Council Meeting Minutes Monday, February 19th at 6:30pm

Pastor Jane presented her report and mentioned Synod Assembly will be on-line June 8, 2024 and discussed our on-going relationship with Wightman.

All reports were adopted by Council.

Call Committee members were installed on February 18th. Members are Ronnie Cromer, Chairman; Andrea Lewis; David Luther, Melodie Waters, and Andy Metz (will be installed at a later date).

Council approved Ministry Site Profile with pending corrections.

Discussed combining all accounts into one for easier budgeting purposes. Will vote in March after careful consideration.

Worship Team has planned Sunday April 28at 4pm for our building loan pay-off celebration. More to come.

Council voted to adopt new election process of Vice-President and Secretary of the congregation. It was determined that no amendments need to be made to our Constitution. Nominations for 3 members each will be placed the same day as council nominations and voted on accordingly.

Stewardship presentation presented by Pastor Ozzie Herlong and Pastor Mike Ward. Two options were presented and discussed: "Stewardship For All Seasons" and "Building A Culture Of Generosity". Council will vote on this at March meeting.

Interim pastor's salary will be increased by 6.4% effective February 29, 2024. Pastor salaries will be raised 3.2% per year. Council also voted to approve 20 hours per week for Valerie, our secretary, starting March 1, 2024.

No ministry team updates at this time.

Shepherding concerns were addressed and council ended with prayer.

Next council meeting will be held March 12th at 6:30pm.

#### Celebrate Our Risen Lord on Easter Sunday, March 31


