Grace, mercy, and peace to you -

As Lutheran Christians, October brings many joys and remembrances that warm our hearts as our temps finally begin to settle down and we enjoy the crispness of Fall. The month of October is filled with so many exciting times – Halloween, Octoberfest celebrations, and of course there's the Reformation!

Of course, the Reformation may not be top of mind for many, but just maybe this year we should move away from the thoughts about how "the church" has been "re-formed," and what is important as followers of Jesus the Christ.

We know the history of what Luther, and other reformers provided at a time that like all things was prescribed by God. The church needed to review how it was conducting its "business," so many came to the front to help instigate changes that opened the eyes of the people. More were able to finally read what is in Holy Scripture, many more people became aware of the amazing grace that is provided freely by God so that we may nurture our faith in Christ and share His Good News.

And what is the "bottom-line" effect we should experience through God's love and grace? We too must be "re-formed," or better, we must be "transformed!" All of what God provides through His unlimited love to creation – especially His crowning joy – humans – is for us to return to the image God has made us to be. And what is that image – being Holy!

Easton's Bible Dictionary describes holiness "in the highest sense as belonging to God (Isaiah 6:3; Revelation 15:4), and to Christians as consecrated to God's service, in so far as we are conformed in all things to the will of God." (Romans 6:19 Romans 6:22; 1 Peter 1:15) Only God is Holy and yet He seeks us to strive to become "like God" but we ourselves cannot.



There are celebrations in October but let us take to heart the one special event - Reformation - that can lead us to our – Transformation – and our return to God as His holy people.

With the arrival of our new pastor, Homecoming Sunday this month, and the holidays just around the corner, it's good time to remember what **you** can do on Facebook to help spread the word about what's happening at Grace!

1.) LIKE AND FOLLOW

Make sure you have liked and are following **Grace Lutheran Church-ELCA** on Facebook! Even if you think you are already good on this step, go check! You might be surprised. By liking the page, you are showing support of Grace, and by following the page, you should be getting updates from Grace in your news feed. Right now our page is sitting at 636 likes and 732 followers. That may seem like a lot already, but let's see how much we can increase these numbers!

2.) REACT AND COMMENT

When you see posts from Grace Lutheran Church-ELCA, like (or love) them and comment on them! Facebook's algorithm prioritizes posts that generate higher levels of interaction, so the more reactions and comments a post gets, the more the post is likely to show up in people's news feeds (and the higher up in them too). The amount of reactions and comments on the church's posts also can be looked at as reflecting how engaged (or not) we are in what's happening at Grace.

3.) SHARE

When we want to tell people about Jesus, what do we say we should do? Share the good news! So if you want to tell people about Grace, what can you do? Share Grace's Facebook posts! A post promoting an upcoming worship service or event? Share it to invite your friends! A post with pictures from a church gathering or activity?
