January is here, and we have a lot of work to do. We will be working on our telephone numbers and addresses and writing our names.

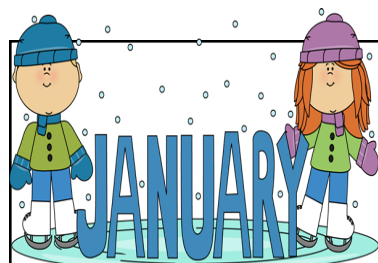
Our units this month are:

Winter Prayer Reflections

Learn about reflection with mirrors and water. Using art, draw pictures of prayer and its reflection in the world.

Activity Plan

1. Stand at a wall mirror or use individual hand held mirrors. Say this prayer wave. The first person says the words and does the action;

then the next person and so on until the action and words have gone through the whole family. Watch self and others as the prayer wave happens.

God we pray. (fold hands in prayer by mouth) [repeated by each person]

God we hope. (hold hands out front with palms up) [repeated by each person]

God we pray for a world of hope. (make a circle with hands) [repeated by each person]

Amen. (bow head)

- What did you see reflected in the mirror?
- How did you know what to do when it was your turn to be in the prayer wave?

2. Sit in a circle around the pan filled with water. Have each person look into the water from above and tell others what they see. Use these questions to talk about reflection.

- How is that the same or different than what you see in the mirror?
 - How did we make the wave in the mirror(s)?
 - How do we make a wave in the water? Try it.
 - Do the waves get bigger or smaller?
3. Everyone fold your hands. Use these questions to talk about prayer.

- Where does our prayer go when we pray?
- Do our prayers get bigger or smaller as we say them?
- How can our prayer reflect into the world as a wave that gets bigger and bigger?

4. Pass out papers and art supplies. Use a different cotton swab for each color of poster paint. Draw a prayer. Then make a bigger picture of the same thing to show our prayer getting bigger and bigger. Talk about your prayer pictures and show the waves. Do the prayer wave again.

5. Variation: If there is snow outside, talk about how things reflect in the snow. Snow is made of frozen water. How can we make waves in snow?
