From Our Interim Pastor

So, here we go! Off and running to explore the possibility of partnering with another congregation to share a pastor to sustain our own ministries here at Grace and at that congregation and also to explore possibilities of ministry together – all in the name of Jesus.

First of all, I want to say thanks to all who have worked so hard to get us to this point. The Wake Up Team has literally spent hours researching and discerning the Spirit's call. The council has received their reports and worked with the Wake Up Team to critique and refine all proposals. And you, Grace family, have met twice to ask your questions, express your doubts, and to think together about what new possibilities there are for Grace congregation to be God's church in this time and in this place.

As I've listened to these conversations over these past months and then listened again at the called congregation meeting on Aug. 13, it's been impossible not to hear the angst that prevails. So many things we don't know – and won't know – until we take those first steps – and then more steps – and more. So many "what if" questions and honestly, more "I don't know" than concrete answers.

All this has brought back the time when I served as a licensed marriage and family therapist on the staff of what was then Lutheran Family Services – now Lutheran Services Carolinas. As part of my training, I participated in several workshops on domestic violence and how to work with and care for those suffering from both physical and emotional abuse. One of the things I learned then – not sure that it still holds true today – but then we were taught that a person (more often than not, a woman) trying to leave a violent home will leave but go back an average of seven times before she finally can be free. That's because the unknown is more scary than the known.


Please hear me! I am not comparing us in any way to domestic violence. I've told you again and again – and I'll say it again now – you are a warm, welcoming, accepting, loving people. What I am saying is that this casting out into the unknown is scary, and the pull to go back to the known is strong.

But have you noticed how powerfully our recent gospel readings for first three Sundays in August have spoken to this? On the 6th, we heard Matthew's account of the feeding of the 5,000. After blessing and breaking the bread and fish, Jesus gave it to the 12 disciples and told them, "you feed them." No one left hungry. On the 13th, we heard Matthew's proclamation that Jesus in indeed the divine, beloved Son of God and on the 20th, that fascinating encounter between Jesus and the Gentile woman who challenged him at his core. And in all these readings, the peace that comes only from God is lifted up.

And so, I pray for us to remember who we are – God's people. I pray for us to remember who Jesus is – God's divine Son. I pray for us to abide together in the boat with Jesus knowing that he not always still the storms. Sometimes he stills those in the storms.



Council Minutes – August 8, 2023

Motions to accept facility requests and adopt reports carried unanimously.

Council elected Brad, Linda, Deborah, and Dale as Sunday School officers.

Regarding financial matters, council voted to move unused front door funds into the Property and Maintenance Fund and to put the Spotts' gift to the congregation into a Money

Market account. Council discussed exploring estimates for bookkeeping/ accounting services.

Telephone service installation with Carolina Connect was expected to be completed soon, at which time the church will end AT&T service.

Beverly also provided updates about progress with quotes on livestreaming, taking care of copyright/privacy considerations with worship content, and job descriptions for church staff.

Robert agreed to check on the building condition of the parsonage.

Council prepared logistics for the congregational vote Aug. 13. Council discussed possibilities of refinancing versus paying off the building loan that could be explored in tandem with exploring partnership. Council reviewed a template parish agreement for outlining conditions of partnership.

As the fall and school year starts, ministry teams were preparing for several upcoming events, including Sunday School kickoff and the start of a new youth class by the Lifelong Education Team.

The Community Hope Team reported that donations to Manna House have been very generous.

Christina presented a plan for a ministry team update task force, and Council voted in support of this outline. This team will meet over the next several months to propose a structure for Grace's ministry teams to renew focus and achieve the church community's goals for the next several years.
